On behalf of the Presbyterian Church in Ireland I would like to acknowledge and commend the response of school leaders, teachers and governors across the school system in Northern Ireland to the many challenges presented by the global pandemic.

The word 'unprecedented' has undoubtedly been overused over recent months, but there still is probably no better description of the sheer enormity of the situation you have all had to confront.
